Ordinance 055-22: Introduced by Mastroianni: An Ordinance accepting and approving the replat of all of lots 8017 and 8018 located at 1062 Parkside Avenue in the City of Alliance, County of Stark, and State of Ohio.

Ordinance 056-22: Introduced by Mastroianni: An Ordinance accepting and approving the replat of part of outlot 442 located at the South terminus of Blenheim Avenue and Center Avenue in the City of Alliance, County of Stark, and State of Ohio.

Ordinance 057-22: Introduced by Mastroianni: An Ordinance accepting and approving the replat of all of lots 1852, 1853, 1854, 1855, 1856 and 12589 located at 350 East State Street in the City of Alliance, County of Stark, and State of Ohio.

Ordinance 059-22: Introduced by Edwards: An Ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Public Safety and enter into a contract with Fontus Blue Inc. at a cost not to exceed \$41,000.00 through December 31, 2023 for software, installation, and consulting services for the Water Treatment Plant.

Ordinance 062-22: Introduced by Mastroianni: An Ordinance vacating part of Miller Avenue, bounded on the North and South by Miller Avenue, bounded on the West by lot 6838, part of lot 6837 & part of out lot 290, and bounded on the East by lot 6839, part of lot 6840 & part of out lot 290; accepting and approving the replat of all of lots 6838 & 6839, part of lots 6837 & 6840, part of out lot 290 and a vacated part of Miller Avenue, located at 191 Maplewood Drive, in the City of Alliance, County of Stark, and State of Ohio.

New Business:

Ordinance 065-22: Introduced by Mastroianni: An Ordinance accepting and approving the replat of all of lot 12705 and part of lot 12636 located at 1725 West State street, in the City of Alliance, County of Stark, and State of Ohio.

Ordinance 066-22: Introduced by Council as a Whole. An Ordinance approving and adopting the extension of an alternative method for apportioning the Stark County Undivided Local Government Fund for 2023 through 2027; authorizing the mayor to execute said agreement; and declaring the same to be an emergency.

Ordinance 81-20: Introduced by Bugara: An Ordinance vacating all of a twenty (20) foot alley bounded on the North by Norfolk Southern Railroad; bounded on the South by Prospect Street; bounded on the East by part of lot 482; and bounded on the West by lot 2094 in the City of Alliance, County of Stark and State of Ohio.

Ordinance 82-20: Introduced by Bugara: An Ordinance vacating all of a twenty (20) foot alley bounded on the North by a twenty (20) foot alley; bounded on the South by lot 11829; bounded on the East by part of lot 231; and bounded on the West by lot 221 in the City of Alliance, County of Stark and State of Ohio.

Ordinance 86-20: Introduced by Council as a Whole: An Ordinance declaring the improvement to certain parcels of real property in the City to be a public purpose and exempt from taxation; providing for the collection and deposit of service payments and

specifying the purpose for which those service payments may be expended; and authorizing compensation payments to the Marlinton Local School District.

Ordinance 86-21S: Introduced by Council as a Whole: An Ordinance affirming the conditions as set forth in Ordinances 23-20 and 37-20; and declaring an emergency.
