An ordinance providing for the abolition of the grade crossing at North Erie Avenue and the Pullsburg St Wayne, Chicago Ill., was read the first time.

Brown moved, seconded by Shuckler, that the Clerk be instructed to furnish each member of the council with a copy of Ord. No. 1335.

Ord. No. 1303
To issue bonds for the purpose of improving and enlarging the present storm sewer system of Albion. was read the second time.

Brown moved seconded by Troy that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three different days be suspended and the ordinance read the second and third time.
