 one, or may enter into a contract with
 an association for the use of a hospital

Yarnney moved, seconded by Farmer that the City Solicitor and council committee meet with the committee of the Hospital Assn. and their counsel for further consideration of the Hospital question.

Which motion was agreed to.

Voss moved, seconded by Yarnney that when we adjourn, we adjourn to meet next Monday evening.

Mr. John H. Gloyd, a member of the Board of Trade, addressed council relative to the proposed new armory building for the city. The state
