April 21st 1913-

Whereas the City of Alliance acting by and through its city council has made known its intention of accepting a certain plat of the property of the undersigned abutting upon Vine Street in said city, and whereas said city required the undersigned to grade the streets to be accepted as shown by said plat. Therefore the undersigned in consideration of said city accepting said plat as submitted then said undersigned agrees to put said streets to grade as shown upon said plat provided further that all dirt taken from said streets be retained and used by the undersigned.

The following petition was presented to council.

To the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio.
We, the undersigned being the owners of the number of feet to property set opposite our names below, being three-fourth or more in interest of the owners of property abutting upon South Freedom Avenue between College Street and State Street, respectfully petition your honorable board for the grading of said street between the points aforesaid preparatory to the future improvement of said street between said points, and the entire cost of said grading is except only such portion thereof as is by law chargeable against the municipality be assessed in proportion to the benefits that will result from said grading upon the lots and land bounding and abutting upon South Freedom Avenue between said points, aforesaid.

And the undersigned and each of them consent and request that said assessment be levied and

and collected without reference to the value of the property of subscribers hereto, and waive all benefits of the statute limiting assessments to $3\frac{1}{3}\%$ of the actual value of the property assessed, and we further agree each of us expressly, agree that in case said grading shall be done as paid for herein, that the same shall be done and so regarded as only preparatory to a future improvement and we expressly waive the limitation of ~~5%~~ ^{50%} in any assessment for the future improvement of said street of ~~6%~~ ^{50%} as provided in Section 3877, General Code.; said assessment to be payable in 6 semi annual installments, proportioned to the whole assessment in cash at the owner of property assessed, in manner provided by law for the levy and collection of assessments.

We beg to submit, for your consideration and acceptance, the following proposition for future domestic and street lighting for the City of Alliance to be fixed by ordinance and contract following your acceptance:

We propose to furnish domestic lighting at the following rates.

For first year, 11¢ per K.W. for first 30 hours use, and 5¢ per K.W. for all in excess.

After first year, 10¢ per K.W. for first 30 hours use, and 5¢ per K.W. for all in excess.

Provided and on condition that we are given contract for street lighting for ten year period at the rate of \$65.00 per arc light for a minimum of 135 arc light, service to be all night and every night instead of present moonlight schedule.
