Mr. Gubb. To authorize and direct J. Ross
Ake County Treasurer of Stark County, Ohio,
to collect by suit the installments
of special assessment past due, levied
against the Stark Electric Railroad was
read the second time.

Fanner moved, seconded by that the

days be suspended, and the resolution

different days be suspended, and the

taken, and resulted Yeas 6 Nays 0.

So the resolution was passed.

instructed to prepare granting
permission to construct a light
standard for Union Co. Watchdog
Street lamps not to exceed
100 watts
