I recommend to your honorable body that an expert be employed to work out some plan by which our present plant can be changed to more fully and completely handle our sewage. This I would suggest should have early and careful consideration.

For the third time we desire to call the attention of your honorable body, the need of some relief from the damage we have suffered from the overflow of the Shattuck run, running north from near Grant Street between the G.C.W. RR and Union Avenue.

The chief causes of the overflow are first inadequate culverts north of Grant Street, second the vast amount of additional water that has been diverted to the stream by recent paving on Milner Street, etc. and storm sewers from Williams Court which formerly following other courses.

At the present time, every ordinary rainfall causes overflows from this stream over our property, backing water upon us for days, washing out foundations of buildings, etc.

We desire that you will investigate this matter at once and apply a remedy that will give us some relief from very bad condition
