The minutes of the previous meeting was read and approved.

Mayor W. D. Barnum returned to council Res. No. 1802, with the following objections which were submitted verbally

1<sup>st</sup>. The street should ~~not~~ be improved the whole length, at the present time with ~~tar~~ tarvia

2. By resurfacing with tarvia 2 1/2" above the present grade. a doubt was expressed as to the legality of the manner in which the grade was being established.

3. The resolution should contain other materials, for improving the street than tarvia, so that there would be competitive bidding so as to obtain the lowest price possible.

Gentlemen

Watson Avenue was opened and graded from State Street southward and when it was graded a natural water course that had been in operation from time immemorial was filled to a depth of two or more feet.

By this water course being filled up it formed a dam across the same and ever since that time the surplus water backs up stream into the 3 cellars of the property owned by Mr and Mrs Frank Kerner to their damage.

If a drain was placed along Watson Avenue leading southward to a depth as low as the original water course it would carry the water off as it did prior to the city filling the same.

The writer suggests that this communication be referred to the Service Department and the committee on Sewers
