Council met Mayor Jones presiding; members present Geo. Milner Jacob Sheffer & W. Sherburn
 Mayor Jones reported that him and the recorder borrowed for the use of the cemetery as previously instructed 1680 dollars for six months at 10% interest being at as low ^{rate} as they could get interest was included in the bond, making the Bond 1764 dollars
 It was ordered that Mayor Jones be granted an order for six dollars for services rendered by himself and assistant in surveying the channel of Creek.
 Resolved that the resignation of H. Jamburn as Town Marshall be accepted
 Resolved that J. W. Kason be

Resolved that Geo. Sutton Geo. Miller
and the clerk be authorized to settle with
the contractor for ~~plank~~ walk, and
estimate the amount due the borough from
each lot owner, and that the same
be placed in the hands of the treasurer
for collection; and the clerk is three weeks
each party owing the borough for plank
walk to come forward and pay the same
within ten days, and if not paid in that
time that it be left with the proper officer
for collection

ordinance passed May 25th 1856

Sec 1st Be it ordained by the Town Council
of the Incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio
That it shall be unlawful for the owners
or occupiers of any premises within said
village ^{to allow} any filth or nuisance to accumulate
on or upon their said premises

Sec 2nd That every person so offending shall
upon the conviction thereof be fined in any
sum not exceeding fifty dollars together with
the costs of suit and the necessary expenses
to remove said filth or nuisance

Sec 3rd It shall be the duty of the Mayor immediately
after the conviction of any person under the
above sections to issue his order or war-
rant to the Marshall commanding him to
remove or abate such nuisance forthwith

Sec 4th That it shall be unlawful for any person
to deposit on or upon any of the streets alleys
or public grounds within said village, any
filth or nuisance; every person so
offending shall upon the conviction ^{of the same}
be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty
dollars together with the costs of prosecution suit
and the necessary expenses of removing
such nuisance

Sec 5th All suits shall be brought in the name
of the Incorporated Village of Alliance Ohio
and shall be removed by judgment
as in other civil suits; and judgment
shall be rendered in the name of said
village for the fees costs and necessary
expenses and shall be collected by
execution as in other cases

Sec 6th All fines collected on the above
ordinance shall be paid into the village
treasury as other fines

Sec 7th This ordinance shall be in full force
from and after its publication
