Alliance, June 13, 1866

Council met pursuant to adjournment. Mayor
Wm. Beckman, Alderman, S. H. ... Minutes
of previous meeting read and adopted.

The petition of D. G. Hester & others asking an
ordinance relative to certain nuisances such as
slaughter houses, was brought up and on motion
of Mr. Beckman granted.

On motion of Mr. Barr, the rule of reading ordi-
nances at three meetings before its passage was
suspended to pass an ordinance relative to
slaughter houses within corporate limits.

The following ordinance was presented to pre-
vent certain nuisances therein named, and the
use of buildings for certain purposes.

Ordinance in relation
to Slaughter houses
40

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the town council of the
incorporated village of Alliance: That it shall be
unlawful for any person or persons to use any
building or buildings within the incorporate
limits of said village as a slaughter house,
or house for rendering lard, tallow or offal, or to
throw anything resulting from slaughtering any
animal of the cattle kind, sheep kind or hog kind,
decayed or spoiled fish, into any stream of water,
or to bury the same near to any person's well or
cistern, within said village, or to throw the same
on the ground within the village limits, or to per-
mit the same to remain anywhere within the
borough limits to the annoyance of any persons.

Sec. 2. Any person violating any part or parts
of section first, shall upon conviction thereof
be fined in any sum not exceeding twenty dollars
or less than five dollars, and pay all expenses
of abating and removing any nuisance named
in section first, and pay all costs of prosecution.

Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of the Marshal, upon
the written order of the Mayor, to remove and
abate any nuisance mentioned in section
first, duly adjudged upon evidence to exist.

This ordinance to take effect and be in force
immediately after its passage, - and publication
